Ten years later, TISC remains true to its Mission as an inclusive, diverse Sailing Community!


We believe the thrill of sailing on the San Francisco Bay and experiencing the joy and challenge of controlling a sailboat should be open to all who seek out this experience. This is why TISC provides facilities and instruction in sailing for people of all skill levels, physical and mental abilities, ethnicities and socio-economic backgrounds. Additionally, sailing is a unique way to teach core life skills to children. TISC utilizes sailing to teach responsibility, respect, communication, and teamwork skills.

In partnership with our generous funders, TISC is committed to providing 75% of children a full or partial scholarship to give them the unforgettable experience of sailing. TISC is a large scale, year round sailing school on the San Francisco Bay that does not have membership requirements and emphasizes full community involvement through offering scholarships. Our dedication to serving low-income children is what sets TISC apart from every other sailing institution in the Bay Area.

2009 MARKED THE TENTH ANNIVERSARY OF the Treasure Island Sailing Center Foundation. It is worth taking a moment to reflect on the impact that we have ha on our community. We started our summer in 1999 with girls who had never been on a boat. I was their instructor on a boat with gear donated by West Marine. Some belie that summer was a test to see if this type of program was possible in the San Francisco Bay. We knew it was the sta to something much more. Since 1999, we have introduced sailing on the San Francisco Bay to thousands of childrer and adults. By our estimate, approximately 8,000 youth and adults have been through one of our programs. We take pride in the fact that most of our participants would never have experienced sailing if not for our program. We would like to thank our numerous supporters over the years, without them, serving our mission would not be possible. With them, our scholarship rate averages 75%; f some programs it is near 100%. We have opportunities fo children of all different socioeconomic backgrounds and these programs give them knowledge and understanding that reaches far beyond the basics of sailing. With the economic crisis in 2009, the TISC Foundation dramatica cut back our operating and capital budget; this left us wit a very small team that focused on supporting our basic programs as we weathered the storm. The TISC Board members and our Operations Director, Lacey Todd, really stepped up to help with daily operations and we all owe them our thanks for keeping the organization running. We start 2010 financially solid and are looking to grow our programs and our onsite team to meet the needs of the community. Already, we have been fortunate to have Michelle Ross join our team as our Executive Director. She comes with years of experience from the Gap, Inc.

# 2009 Program Impact

TISC is proud to have provided over **13,687 hours of instruction to 1,050 youth participants**, with a **41% return/repeat rate** to ensure that children are connecting to the sport of sailing and participating in our positive, sailing community. Staying true to our mission, TISC provided 75% of its youth participants with scholarships to attend our programs.

### Opening our doors to all children who have a desire to learn and grow through sailing

TISC's programs are open to children from all backgrounds, ethnicities and abilities. We offer full scholarships to children from families who have proof of government assistance and partial scholarships (50% off tuition) for children from families with a combined household income of less than \$65,000.

Most of the children served by TISC reside in San Francisco and live in various districts, such as Chinatown, the Mission, Hunters Point, and Treasure Island. We also have students who come to us from all around the Bay Area, including Richmond, Oakland and Marin City. Year after year, TISC continues to have strong collaborations with many community programs, including:

### Leading Through Example




# **Financial Summary**

# 2010 Programs

In 2010, our main focus continues to be serving youth, therefore TISC plans to serve more than 1,190 children, ages 7 to 18 through our Youth Sailing Program, including 200 who are physically or developmentally disabled, through our Adaptive Sailing Courses. These numbers do not include our return rate; these are totals for the unduplicated participants. Our participants typically have a 41% return/repeat rate within a given year indicating that many of them come back for more than just one class.


The main objective of the Youth Sailing Program is to teach children important life skills such as teamwork, communication, and decision-making through the sport of sailing. Our innovative programs give children, with and without special needs, access to challenges and rewards that will inspire them to strive to achieve their own personal goals on and off the water. Our programs include 1-2day orientations to sailing, week long summer sailing and adventure camps, and 1-2 month long beginning through advanced courses during the school year.

We also plan to serve 456 participants through our Adult Sailing and Adult Adventure Program. The Adult Sailing Classes are offered on J24's and FJ's making us one of the only sailing schools to offer small boat instruction to adults. Additionally, our Adult Adventure Program includes sailing trips, kayaking and stand up paddle boarding and provides important opportunities for the adults in our community to get out on the water.

Treasure Island Sailing Center is a non-profit 501(c)(3)organization operated by volunteers and dedicated staff members as a multi-use community sailing center. TISC provides facilities and instruction in sailing and boating safety for people of all skill levels, physical and mental abilities, ethnicities, and socioeconomic backgrounds. TISC was founded in 1999 and provides sailing lessons — from beginning instruction to advanced level racing — to more than 1,200 children and teenagers per year through its Youth Sailing and Adaptive Sailing Programs. The Adaptive Sailing Program offers a range of introductory through racing classes for children and adults with physical or developmental disabilities.
