LETTER FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

IT IS HARD TO BELIEVE THAT ANOTHER "PANDEMIC YEAR" HAS GONE BY.

Last year our organization had to make some very difficult decisions to downsize our team and weather the storm. This year, we rebuilt a foundation that will support pre-pandemic programs and post-pandemic growth. Our approach to pandemic adversity was to "make lemonade out of lemons" whenever possible. Our three priorities were to:

- Get kids outside and into nature with one another to help them recover from months of remote learning
- Support learning and growth by increasing leadership and education opportunities
- ▶ Invest in organizational infrastructure to provide a strong foundation for post pandemic success

From a programs standpoint, we brought back about 90% of our youth programs, added two new ones, and improved the curriculum across the board. Thanks to our new collaborations with local scientists and environmental designers, our STEM curriculum has never been more impactful. Our TI Maritime Education & Leadership Program (TIME to Lead) was launched with the Life Learning Academy (a local High School on TI) and has so much potential to teach life changing skills to every teenager on the Island. We also expanded our Instructor in Training (13-15yo) and Junior Instructor (16-17yo) training and leadership programs to develop key skills in our future sailing coaches and teachers. We look forward to the full return of our adult programs in 2022 as the pandemic evolves.

From an organizational standpoint, the changes were likely less noticeable to our community. We have greatly optimized our technology systems, and with the support of Lyn Paleo, PhD we have a logic model that connects activities, outcomes and impact measures for every class that we offer. This, paired with our improved metric tracking, registration and database system, is setting the foundation for a stronger, better, more effective TISC.

As many of you know, Development Director, Rosie Spaulding, engaged our stakeholders in a survey to ensure that our vision includes your vision of what TISC should be as we transition to a more permanent future. We truly appreciate your input and look forward to sharing results and future plans in 2022.

2022 will welcome a number of exciting developments at TISC. Here are a few highlights:

- New technology and software at TISC to optimize our registration process and communication capabilities.
- ► TISC now has a professional program evaluator who has developed a comprehensive evaluation plan with data collected from parents, coaches, teachers, as well as youth and adult participants. Staff will review and discuss these results three times a year for continuous quality improvement.
- An improved dingly ramp to make it easier to access the water.
- ➤ Collaboration with the Cal sailing team, both through the sharing a Head Coach, and participating in Friday Night Racing
- A new Administrative and Outreach Coordinator, Gresha Wallace, whose responsibilities include developing the volunteer program and improving outreach, marketing and communication efforts.
- ► We are hiring! We are actively recruiting a Head Coach and Executive Director to join our team in 2022.

We are so thankful for the quality and commitment of our existing management, staff and instructional teams for their endless support of our mission. We know our current and future team members will drive TISC's growth and development forward in 2022 and beyond.

Junior Sailing

This year TISC adjusted to the pandemic and rebuilt the capacity of youth programs with the goal to get kids outside and on the water so they could enjoy being together and out of isolation. After most schools spent up to a year and half in remote learning, we believe there was never a more important time for outside recreation than this past summer. Maintaining our pandemic precautions, classes were held predominantly outdoors, and each group had their own home base in the yard with a picnic table and canopy shelter. Thanks to mask-wearing, daily screening, and practicing distancing, there were zero reports of Covid cases. The natural ventilation that comes with sailing makes it an excellent activity during a pandemic!

We ran weekend youth programs on Saturdays and Sundays in the spring and fall, which included the debut this fall of our teen windsurfing class. Summer camp ran for nine weeks, with beginners getting out on the water for the very first time, more experienced sailors honing their skills, and everyone getting to make new friends and memories on Clipper Cove.

During the last session we were able to bring in groups from the Francisco Middle School community hub for free week-long Explore Group camps. Our partnerships with local organizations are a valuable way that TISC provides access to sailing to the larger community. The orientations that have been a long standing tradition at TISC will be the final program to return in 2022.





Junior Leadership

The Junior Leadership Program offered teens a gateway between learning and teaching, providing practical instruction in group management, boat handling, and how to combine chalk talks with engaging drills and games to teach sailing skills.

This summer we hired four lead coaches and two assistant coaches who had participated in the Junior Leadership Program. It is exciting to hire teens who grew up as sailors in our programs for their first year of coaching! To develop our depth of instructors and ensure that we facilitate diversity in sailing education and coaching, we will continue to provide Instructor in Training opportunities for our young sailors so they can develop their skills as sailors, coaches, and young adults entering the workforce. In 2022, we look forward to offering our instructors and junior instructors specialized safety training geared towards young workers, and a specialized diversity, equity, inclusion and belonging training so they have the skillsets to make every child feel comfortable and included at TISC.

In November we introduced TIME to Lead, a leadership program for high school students offered to the Life Learning Academy on Treasure Island. By learning how to sail and work together on J24s, participants gain confidence and acquire skills that they can apply in other areas of their lives. We plan to expand this program in 2022!



Science and Sailing Camp

To help bridge some of the education gap imposed by the pandemic, we offered summer camp options that merged Science and Sailing. Our sailors explored Clipper Cove as scientists, learning about ecosystems and food webs, and the San Francisco Bay as a watershed. These concepts came to life through hands-on activities like creating a watershed out of paper and searching for microplastics at the beach. Through the session, sailors took measurements and recorded the conditions in Clipper Cove, drawing pictures and creating graphs to display their findings.

Science and Sailing uses a curriculum initially developed for the 5th-grade Sailing to Save the Seas program. TISC is fortunate to be working with Benthic Lab and California College of the Arts. This partnership has led to the construction of a PlanktoScope for TISC, which allows for a real-time exploration of the organisms present in samples of water from Clipper Cove. We will continue this program to foster curiosity about the natural world in all of our sailors, leading to a sense of stewardship for the Bay.

Set, Sail, Learn

In 2020, we started the year with remote STEM classes. Along with SFUSD's return to in-person school this fall, TISC was thrilled to be able to have 24 classes visit TISC for in-person Set Sail Learn field trips! For those classes where in-person field trips were still not an option, we continued some virtual field trips. Virtual field trips bring a little bit of the Bay into the classroom, introducing ecology through games, activities, and an exciting encounter with a red rock crab.

Many of the fourth graders who came to sail and learn about the Bay asked about when they could come back! Set Sail Learn continues to offer a unique opportunity for 4th graders to get out on the water and gain an increased understanding of the Bay as a natural habitat. Every single one returns home with stories of adventure and an invitation to return for out of school sailing opportunities.

KEELBOAT COURSES

While TISC's formal US Sailing Basic Keelboat course provides the novice sailor with all the skills needed to sail independently, this course is only the first in a range of courses designed to train the next generation of safe boaters. TISC offers a series of self-guided practices called Skills Days as well as a 2-weekend Advanced Sailing course facilitating continued sailing education and experience.

DINGHY SAILING

Dinghy Sailing classes were by far the most popular option in 2021 given the distancing options and flexibility the classes provide. We will continue to expand the number of available courses in 2022.

RENTAL PROGRAM

TISC rents out our J24's, RS Ventures, Vanquard 15's, Lasers, Kayaks, and Standup Paddle Boards. While there is a rigorous checkout for each craft, students who have graduated TISC's courses are sure to qualify. TISC welcomes all sailors and invites you to either take a class or pass one of our skill checkouts to rent our boats on Clipper Cove.

At the end of each Summer Camp, sailors received 3 stickers with icons to put on a 6-foot long thermometer to answer critical questions about their experience. We use this approach to check in with students and understand what we are doing well and where we can do better. A longer survey is emailed to parents who are asked to provide feedback in more depth.

DIVERSITY, EQUITY & INCLUSION

This year the DEI Committee focused on launching the TIME to Lead Program which focuses on teaching new sailors leadership skills through teamwork on keelboats. The curriculum teaches sailors how to lead themself before they lead others with core skills being taught, practiced, and evaluated through sailing. Additionally, the committee began interviewing sailing heroes who stand out and are role models to our kids, particularly those with diversity in race, ethnicity, gender and sexual orientation. We are continuously evaluating ways to improve our impact and role on DEI in sailing and have recently partnered with RISE, a national nonprofit that educates and empowers the sports community to eliminate racial discrimination, champion social justice and improve race relations, to provide training to our staff, instructors, and youth.

ANNUAL APPEAL Make a Difference

Our annual appeal ran over a four week span in December. Each email featured different aspects of TISC to highlight some of TISC's successes in 2021. In addition to sharing highlights about the year, there were three goals for the campaign — to solicit donations, recruit volunteers and promote current career opportunities at TISC.

Our annual appeal raised \$14,075 in 2021, a 14% increase from 2020.

In total, for 2021 TISC raised \$40,316 from individual donations and welcomed 786 volunteer hours.
